MAK Specials as part of the VIENNA ART WEEK 2014

With the opening of the exhibition *I Santillana*, a performance by Michael Riedel, an exhibition talk with Valentin Ruhry, as well as guided tours, the MAK is offering a highly diverse program of events

With its high-quality program, the MAK is once again taking part in the VIENNA ART WEEK, which takes place from 17 to 23 November 2014. The MAK's program kicks off with the opening of the exhibition *I Santillana* on 18 November 2014, in which the works of the glass artists Laura de Santillana and Alessandro Diaz de Santillana are presented for the very first time in Austria. After the opening of the exhibition, the performance *Michael Riedel reads Oskar* will take place in the context of the MAK NITE Lab. During that evening, the German artist will transform the MAK Columned Main Hall—analogous to the legendary Oskar-von-Miller Straße 16 (2000–2011)—into a gigantic audio-visual player. The program will continue on 20 November with a conversation with the Austrian artist Valentin Ruhry amid his current exhibition *APPLIED ARTS. NOW. Valentin Ruhry. Grand Central* in the MAK GALLERY. Expert-guided tours through the MAK DESIGN LAB on 18 November, the exhibition *BRÜDER SCHWADRON new places & traces* on 20 November in the MAK Branch Geymüllerschlössel, supplement the varied program.

MAK NITE Lab Michael Riedel reads Oskar

Tuesday, 18 November 2014 8 p.m., MAK Columned Main Hall

Based in Frankfurt am Main, the artist Michael Riedel, born 1972, interferes with the very system of the art world with his conceptual overpaintings. True to the motto "Record—Label—Play Back," the language of cultural events, art institutions, and publications is analyzed and, by appropriating the media and "icons" of contemporary art like Gilbert & George, Christopher Wool, Jim Isermann, and Joseph Kosuth, the idea of the Factory (Andy Warhol) is reactivated—at times with other, like-minded artists. Riedel's first interventions took place in the context of the legendary art space Oscar-von-Miller Straße 16, which was originally located opposite the Portikus. Initiated in 2000, it was simultaneously a studio, exhibition space, and party location. In one of his current projects, Riedel has sent a selection of the art space's program until 2011 on tour, accompanied by his recently published book *Oskar*. *Michael Riedel* (2014). **Curators:** Bärbel Vischer, Curator, MAK Contemporary Art Collection, and Marlies
