In the context of the *StadtFabrik* [City factory], the MAK hosts a panel discussion with leaders in the field about the opportunities and creative-economy aspects of commoning.

The concept of commoning is gaining ever more importance as a possible trendsetter for an alternatively structured social and economic future that is oriented around the common good. Curated by the IDRV – Institute of Design Research Vienna, the *StadtFabrik* (a project in the context of the cooperation *design* new *strategies* between the MAK and the Vienna Business Agency, creative center departure) will launch a debate about possible ways in which the creative economy and design can contribute to commoning with regard to positive social change.

Conceived as a real-time research laboratory, the *StadtFabrik* explores new creative industrial occupations and future urban potentialities in a city undergoing transformation. Against a backdrop of urbanization and automation, new strategies will be negotiated for Vienna as a space for living, working, and producing. Commons (common goods)—understood to be material and spatial resources; immaterial goods such as information, knowledge, art, and culture; and software—form one of the project's key focal points. Only in combination with innovative social processes like co-creation or co-production—namely commoning—do commons become usable.

The discussion at the MAK will introduce principles of the economy for the common good, as well as applications from creative industrial practice.
