## START OF THE SEASON AT THE GEYMÜLLERSCHLÖSSEL

From 6 May to 2 December 2018, the MAK Branch Geymüllerschlössel invites you to an insight into the atmosphere of the Empire and Biedermeier periods

From 6 May to 2 December 2018, the Geymüllerschlössel in Pötzleinsdorf is once again open to visitors on Sundays from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. With its mixture of Gothic, Indian, and Arabic styles typical of pleasure buildings of that time, this branch of the MAK is one of the few locations in Austria where one can savor the atmosphere of Empire and Biedermeier summer residences. In the park of the Schlössel, both the sculptural ensemble *Der Vater weist dem Kind den Weg* [The Father Shows his Child the Way] by Hubert Schmalix (1996/1997) and James Turrell's Skyspace *The other Horizon* (1998/2004) represent contemporary aspects of this dialogue with the past.

The Geymüllerschlössel in Pötzleinsdorf was commissioned after 1808 by the merchant and banker Johann Jakob Geymüller (1760–1834) as a "summer house" and was owned by the family until 1842. Thereafter it had several owners before finally being sold to the Republic of Austria in 1948 by the Austrian National Bank. The purchase price was paid by Franz Sobek, who received a lifelong right of residence in return. In 1965 it was incorporated into the MAK as a branch of the museum. In addition to the 160 exquisite Old-Viennese clocks on permanent display from the Franz Sobek Collection, Empire and Biedermeier furniture from the Furniture Collection of the MAK complement the elegant overall impression of the Geymüllerschlössel.

Every Sunday at 3 p.m from 6 May to 2 December 2018, guided tours offer an insight into the diversity of Biedermeier life (tour fee € 3.50, no registration is necessary).
