START OF THE SEASON AT THE GEYMÜLLERSCHLÖSSEL

Free admission with MAK ticket during the 2019 season

From 5 May to 1 December 2019, the Geymüllerschlössel in Pötzleinsdorf is again open on Sundays. For the first time, this year a ticket to the MAK includes a one-time free admission to this MAK branch. As the only publicly accessible summer residence of the Empire and Biedermeier period in Austria, the Geymüllerschlössel invites visitors to submerge themselves in the lifestyle of the early 19th century. A main attraction of this year's Schlössel season is a matinée concert on 16 June 2019 with the Swiss soprano legend Edith Mathis, the Salzburg baritone Rafael Fingerlos, and the German pianist Sascha El Mouissi. On 29 June, the MAK extends an invitation to the summer festival in the Geymüllerschlössel, and on 26 October the Schlössel is part of the 2019 MAK DAY. Each Sunday at 3 p.m., guided tours afford a glimpse into the rich variety of Biedermeier life.

The program of the matinée concert features works by the composer Rober Schumann and the poet Heinrich Heine. The focus is on *A Poet's Love*, a cycle of 16 songs by the composer Robert Schumann, who in his Opus 48 created a masterpiece of romantic art song. The cycle was inspired in 1840 by Heine's *Lyrical Intermezzo*, a collection of 65 poems. The baritone Rafael Fingerlos, accompanied by the pianist Sascha El Mouissi, interprets the 16 titles of *A Poet's Love*, as well as other songs by Schumann. Edith Mathis complements their presentation with a reading of poems by Heinrich Heine.

The Geymüllerschlössel in Pötzleinsdorf was commissioned after 1808 by the merchant and banker Johann Jakob Geymüller (1760–1834) as a "summer house" and was owned by the family until 1842. Thereafter it had several owners before finally being sold by the Austrian National Bank to the Republic of Austria in 1948, and in 1965 was incorporated into the MAK as a branch of the museum. In addition to the 160 exquisite old Viennese clocks on permanent display from the Franz Sobek Collection, Empire and Biedermeier furniture from the MAK Furniture Collection complement the elegant overall impression of the Geymüllerschlössel.

In the park of the Schlössel, both the sculptural ensemble *Der Vater weist dem Kind den Weg* [The father shows the way to his child] by Hubert Schmalix (1996/1997) and James Turrell's Skyspace *The other Horizon* (1998/2004) represent contemporary aspects of this dialogue with the past.
