Under the banner *BACK TO THE FUTURE. Design & Everyday Life at the MAK. Then and Now!*, as part of this year's ORF Long Night of Museums, the MAK is offering a view into the multifaceted and internationally renowned MAK Collection. Tours and workshops will acquaint visitors with highlights from the applied arts, design, architecture, and contemporary art from the past to nowadays. These include Gustav Klimt's design drawings for the mosaic frieze in the dining room of the Stoclet House in Brussels, objects from the Wiener Werkstätte, world-famous Thonet bentwood furniture, Margarete Schütte-Lihotzky's *Frankfurt Kitchen*, and fashion designer Helmut Lang's archive. As part of the children's workshop *How Did Grandpa's Grandpa Live?*, the entire family will be prompted to go on a scavenger hunt through the MAK. What did a dining room and bedroom look like back then? How were kitchens and bathrooms furnished? On the basis of objects from the MAK Collection, the workshop *3-D Printer Street* shows how objects small and large can be printed with 3-D printing technology.
