MAK Special Events during VIENNA DESIGN WEEK 2015

The MAK is hosting a potpourri of culinary interventions, talks, and experimental presentations on design as a tool for positive change.

With special tours, talks, a book presentation, and an experiment that combines food and design, once again this year the MAK is offering a diverse program of events during VIENNA DESIGN WEEK from 25 September to 4 October 2015. The DESIGN NITE on 29 September organized by the MAK and departure, the creative center of the Vienna Business Agency, will deal with the theme of the VIENNA BIENNALE 2015: "Ideas for Change." Among the highlights of the evening is a performative presentation by FREITAG, the maker of recycled bags, as well as a culinary experiment by the formally radical designer duo chmara.rosinke and a book presentation by internationally renowned architect and designer Martin Mostböck. A matinee event with numerous high-profile guests at the MAK Branch Geymüllerschlössel on 4 October will be dedicated to the influence of design education on the development of creative visions for the future on the occasion of the exhibition MAK DESIGN SALON #04: DUNNE & RABY. CHANGE WITHOUT A TRACE hosted by FREITAG and produced by HEUER/Karls Garten

The designers from FREITAG have been invited to plan a DESIGN NITE and an installation at the MAK DESIGN SPACE on the VIENNA BIENNALE theme of "Ideas for Change." To them, change means recontextualization. In addition to their well-known bags made of used truck tarps, now they have developed biodegradable textiles: F-ABRIC closes the loop of constant change, leaving nothing behind. For their performative presentation during DESIGN NITE, they will take food, clothing, music, and ideas out of their usual environment, place them into surprising contexts, and present an interactive exhibition with a pop-up-store featuring F-ABRIC.

CHMARA.ROSINKE: Cucina Futurista 2.0

Inspired by Filippo Tommaso Marinetti's 1930 manifesto of futurist cooking, chmara.rosinke promote a new creative radicalness in haute cuisine. The "great freedom"



of the round white plate will be limited and cooks will be inspired to explore new paths in cuisine along with designers. The emphasis will not be on the design of dishes and utensils, but on cooking according to formal criteria. An experiment in food and design, made possible by the Nespresso Design Scholarship 2014.
