The service was personally commissioned on the birth of his son in 1811 by Napoleon I, Emperor of France, from Martin Guillaume Biennais. Biennais was not himself active as executing master craftsman, he designed pieces, had them executed by various goldsmiths and put them together as ensembles after they were finished. In 1903 the MAK was able to acquire the following pieces from the portable service which has not been preserved in its entirety: tall pot with handle along with warmer and burner, low pan with handle, cocoa pot, sugar bowl with six spoons, two bedroom candlesticks, two table candlesticks, censer, bourdalou (chamber pot), enema, tweezers.

STEINGLÄSER, 56–72

"Steingläser" form a group of their own amongst the colored glasses of the Biedermeier period. They are so called for their imitation of semi-precious or precious stones, and are colored or tinted either as glass frit (as a whole or in part) through casing or flashing, or in the surface (as a whole or partially through firing in metal compounds). Amongst the most notable "Steingläser" (manufactured in glasshouse processes, some of which were patented) are:

BEINGLAS (Bone Glass)

Clouded glass, grading between translucent and opaque; this effect is obtained by the addition of burnt bones and repeated "warming" during forming whilst mixing in the colors: "Agatin" and "stone glasses" belong to this type.

AGATIN

At the exhibitions of commercial products in Vienna, 1835 and 1839, and also in Prague in 1836, Georg Count von Buquoy exhibited articles made of clouded colored (bone-) glass metal from his factories in Georgenthal and Silberberg. They were described as “Agatin”, “Achatin”, “Achat” (agate), “opal imitation,” or “Opal”; some were given more detailed color descriptions.

OPAL GLASS

A bone glass composition without the addition of coloring metal oxides. Through the addition of bone ash the glass is clouded to a whitish hue. It is opalescent in light, and iridescent (in contrast to pure white milk glass—obtained through the addition of tin oxide—which appears white even in light).

COPPER GLASS

Opaque red glass, obtained by adding copper compounds to the frit, or marbled through diversely colored layers, for instance hyalite and “rothwelsches” (Italian red) glass. Later the term also included translucent glasses tinted red through copper ruby-red mordant in the surface.

HYALITE

Hard black glass made opaque through the addition of slag (hyalite = glass stone). The invention was attributed to Georg Count Buquoy himself and production was patented and carried out in his South Bohemian glasshouse in Silberberg from 1816/17 onwards, and later also in Georgenthal. From 1819 onwards simple opaque red hyalite (through the addition of copper ash) was introduced, and in 1820 hyalite “with colored veins”.

“ROTHWELSCHE” (Red Italian) GLASS

Already manufactured ca. 1764/70 in the glassworks of the Counts of Harrach, Neuwald (later Neuwelt/Nový Svět) in the Riesengebirge. After ceasing production it was re-introduced ca. 1820. Through the addition of copper ash or hammer forging scales and in a process of repeated heating, molten glass (“Walsch,” “Welsch” red = Italian red) is tinted to display a rich spectrum of colors from yellowish-red through dark purple-brown to blackish-brown and shows a pronounced marbling on the cut surface.

“METAL GLASS”

Thus named by Joseph Zich, and developed in 1823 in his glasshouse in Schwarzau near Harmanschlag (Lower Austria) according to his own patented process, which produced an opaque black glass.

“STEINGLASS”

“Stone glass” is the term used by Joseph Zich to designate various colored (bone) glasses which he produced in a patented—or “privileged”, as it was then termed— manufacturing process in his glasshouse in Joachimsthal near Harmanschlag (Lower Austria).

LITHYALIN

The manufacture was based on a process invented by Friedrich Egermann in Blottendorf near Haida (Northern Bohemia), and patented at the beginning of 1829. Through firing in silver (and/or copper compounds) various (colorless or colored) glass types are dyed in the surface, or tinted with subtly interchanging hues.

Originally this armchair was part of a suite in the music room of the Archduchess Sophie in Schloss Laxenburg. A contemporary gouache by Johann Stephan Decker shows the room in its original arrangement and colorfulness. Through this it was possible to restore the appropriate fabric covering in its typical two-color scheme. The monochrome upholstery receives its clarifying structure from the contrasting braid trimmings.

The armchair belongs to a suite made for the reception room in the "Palais Erherzog Karl" (now the Albertina). After the death of his uncle, Duke Albert of Saxe-Teschen, the latter, Archduke Karl, commissioned the architect Josef Kornhäusel to redesign the Palais as a town and winter residence, and refurnish the interior with Danhauser furniture. The armchairs are of interest from the methodological point of view because Danhauser reinforced the fragile armrests with iron from within and formed parts of the decor out of plaster (the rosettes on the back-rest) and linen strips (the crossed bands of the armrests).

This standing desk is one of the few pieces of signed Viennese furniture from the 1st half of the 19th century. Typologically the combined functions of standing desk and writing table go back to English models of the late 18th century. The height of the desk can be altered by means of cogs and steering racks. For its use as a writing table the desk top can be drawn forward on arris rails to give the knees room for seated writing. Placed one on top of the other in the rear side of the desk top are two drawers, which can be pulled out sideways and swiveled forwards along the top to an angle of 90 degree. The material combination of grained ashwood and polished steel is ultramodern for 1800, at that time grained

woods were amongst the most expensive types of wood.

A gouache by Johann Stephan Decker shows this free-standing lady's writing table in its original place, in the drawing room of the Archduchess Sophie in Schloss Laxenburg. The round recesses of the drawer mantel are designed to accommodate flowers. The oval shape of the writing top is harmoniously counterbalanced by the foot cushion, added to provide warmth and insulation. The cabinetmaker paid special attention to the working of the veneer grain on the rear side of the drawer mantel.
